SCC Club Championship Starts the New Year

Last year's SCC Late Fall Swiss was a 7 round affair with 24 players. It ended on Thursday, December 16. The co-winners with 6/7 pts. were Imtiaz Husain and Jim Paterson.

On Thursday, January 6 we will start the 2004-5 SCC Club Championship. This is divided into 2 sections. The Championship section is a 10 person round – robin of the highest rated players registering. This year we will be charging an entry fee to this tournament, and all fees will be returned in prize money. You must become an SCC member to play – SCC has tournament memberships in addition to the normal annual membership. The second section is the “Reserves” section and is usually an 8 round swiss. There is no entry fee for members for this tournament, as is the case for all other SCC tournaments during the year. So start the New Year off right with some friendly but competitive chess at SCC ! John Henderson

(1836-96)

- * Mayor, Saint-Liboire, Quebec for 8 years
- * Magistrate, Saint-Hyacinthe, Quebec for 12 years
- * Montreal Gazette chess editor and columnist 1886-96
- * First Canadian Correspondence Champion 1878
- * Won Correspondence Tournament 1873 (not a round-robin)
- * Won Hamilton Chess Club Correspondence Tournament for Canadians concluded 1882
- * Played Canadian Championship 1872 (3rd), 1879, 1881, 1882 (2nd), 1884 (2nd)
- * Problem composer

Top Ranked Canadians at Year-end 2004

Grandmaster Kevin Spraggett, originally from Montreal, Quebec, is the top ranked Canadian chess player at year-end of 2004, for the 3rd time in a row (2002-4) and for a record 22nd time since 1980.

Natalia Khoudgarian, of Toronto, Ontario, is the top ranked Canadian female chess player at year-end of 2004, for the 9th time in a row (1996-2004).
